Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission Completes Last Week of Listening Session

Deliberation Dates set for December

Phoenix, AZ - Arizona's Independent Redistricting Commission will complete its final week of listening to in-person comments and virtual town halls the week of December 4, 2021. The schedule is on the following link: draft maps public hearings. With only six in-person meetings and one virtual town hall meeting left, the Commissioners are anticipating high numbers of attendance at each of the sessions. The participation has been extremely high over the past three weeks of commenting sessions, registering well over 50 speakers at a couple of sessions, in Cottonwood and 82 speakers in Prescott Valley. In addition, receipt of online comments and map submissions has been at an all-time high as members of the public become familiar with using the mapping tools. The commission implemented a Mapping Monday with Mark, a virtual Q & A session to help address the use of the mapping tool. Members of the public can look up what congressional district they are in by typing their address into the following link: Congressional District lookup, and if they would like to look up what legislative district they are in that can be done on this link: Legislative District lookup.

Final decision-making meetings on the Congressional and Legislative district maps have been set for Dec. 6, 9, 16, 17, 20, 21 and 22, 2021. The five-member Commission will have seven days of deliberation on the map redrawing taking into considerations the six criteria outlined in the Arizona Constitution <u>Arizona proposition 106</u>, over 2,000 public comments received online, in person, virtually and emailed; in addition to the receipt 198 map submitted through the mapping tool, this number does not included maps on paper submitted to the Commissioners. IRC MISSION: The Independent Redistricting Commission's mission is to redraw Arizona's congressional and legislative districts to reflect the results of the most recent census. The concept of one-person, one-vote dictates that districts should be roughly equal in population. Other factors to be considered are the federal Voting Rights Act, district shape, geographical features, respect for communities of interest and potential competitiveness. The state Constitution requires the commissioners – two Republicans, two Democrats and an independent chairperson – to start from scratch rather than redraw existing districts.

A new Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission was appointed in January 2021 to adopt new congressional and legislative districts for Arizona.
