Pursuant to Article IV, Part 2, § (12) of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the Commissioners of the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission and the general public that the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission will hold a meeting open to the public on November 3, 2003, at 8:00 a.m. at 1400 West Washington, Suite B-10, Phoenix, Arizona.

NOTE: All matters on the agenda may be presented, discussed and/or are subject to possible decision by the Commission in person or electronically.

The agenda is as follows:

- I. Call to Order.
- II. Public Comment.

This is the time for consideration and discussion of comments and complaints from the public. Those wishing to address the Commission shall request permission in advance by filling out a speaker slip. Action taken as a result of public comment will be limited to directing staff to study the matter or rescheduling the matter for further consideration and decision at a later date unless it is the subject of an item already on the agenda.

NOTE: The Commission may hold additional public comment periods during this public meeting on the call of the Chairman as necessary and appropriate to accommodate the public.

- III. The Commission may vote to go into executive session, which will not be open to the public, for any item listed on the agenda, for the purpose of discussion or consultation for legal advice with the Commission's attorneys pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A)(3) and/or for the purpose of discussion or consultation with the Commission's attorneys in order to consider its position and instruct its attorneys regarding the Commission's position in pending or contemplated litigation pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A)(4).
- IV. Possible discussion, decision and/or adoption of Resolution(s) related to the Commission's finances, payment of contractors, the Commission's continued operation and/or possible future legal action or litigation.
- V. Possible discussion, decision and/or approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with Maricopa County for the purpose of providing financial assistance to the Commission.
- VI. Possible discussion and/or decision related to affirmation, modification or repeal of the current Congressional and Legislative Redistricting Plans.
- VII. Adjournment.
