<u>AMENDED</u> NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING AND POSSIBLE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE ARIZONA INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

Date and Time: Tuesday, June 25, 2002 – 12:30 p.m.

Pursuant to Article IV, Part 2, § (12) of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §38-431.02, amended notice is hereby given to the Commissioners of the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission and the general public that the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission will hold a meeting open to the public on June 25, 2002, at 12:30 p.m. at the Wyndham Buttes Resort, 2000 Westcourt Way, Tempe, Arizona.

The Commission may vote to go into executive session, which will not be open to the public, for any item listed on the agenda, for the purpose of discussing personnel matters (A.R.S. 38-431.03(A)(1)), consulting with Commission attorneys, regarding pending or contemplated litigation (A.R.S. 38-431.03(A)(4)), or obtaining legal advice (A.R.S. 38-431.03(A)(3)).

The agenda for the meeting is as follows:

- I. Call to Order.
- II. Public Comment.

This is the time for consideration and discussion of comments and complaints from the public. Those wishing to address the Commission shall request permission in advance by filling out a speaker slip. Action taken as a result of public comment will be limited to directing staff to study the matter or rescheduling the matter for further consideration and decision at a later date unless it is the subject of an item already on the agenda.

NOTE: The Commission may hold additional public comment periods throughout the meeting on the call of the Chairman as necessary and appropriate to accommodate the public.

- III. Possible report on the competitiveness of congressional districts.
- IV. Report(s) by NDC, possible discussion(s) and possible instruction(s)/decision(s) concerning alternatives and changes to the 2002 Legislative Redistricting Plan and the possible development of a permanent legislative map.
- V. The Commission may vote at any time to go into an Executive session that is not open to the public for the purpose of discussion or consultation for legal advice with the Commission's attorneys pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A)(3) and for the purpose of discussion or consultation with the Commission's attorneys in order to consider its position and instruct its attorneys regarding the Commission's position in pending or contemplated litigation pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A)(4).
- VI. Discussion of possible future Commission Meeting(s).
- VII. Possible Executive Director's report.
- VIII. Adjournment.
