- 2 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Adolfo, is there anybody in the
- 3 office from the public?
- 4 MR. ECHEVESTE: No.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay.
- 6 MR. ECHEVESTE: Staff -- Lou and Kristina -- and
- 7 the redorder.
- 8 CHAIRMAN LYNN: It is the appointed hour, so I
- 9 will call the meeting to order. The next item on the
- 10 agenda -- oh, Lisa, we should probably do our own roll
- 11 call for the record for the public recorder.
- MS. HAUSER: Okay.
- 13 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Let me do that. And is Jose
- 14 going to join us or not?
- MS. HAUSER: No. He can't.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. Let me call roll then.
- 17 Ms. Minkoff.
- 18 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: I'm here.
- 19 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Elder.
- MR. ELDER: Present.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall.
- MR. HALL: Yes.
- 23 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork.
- MR. HUNTWORK: Present.
- 25 CHAIRMAN LYNN: The chairman is present. So all

- 1 five members are present. Lisa Hauser is staff attorney
- 2 to the Commission, also present, and Commission staff in
- 3 the office.
- 4 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: And Doug.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: And Doug Johnson, consultant to
- 6 the Commission.
- 7 Item 2, discussion, decision, or
- 8 instructions concerning the resolution designating
- 9 Arizona Legislative Council to work with the Census
- 10 Bureau. I think all of you have received, hopefully, a
- 11 revised draft resolution Lisa prepared.
- 12 And, Lisa, why don't you take just a minute
- 13 and for everyone's benefit just quickly summarize why
- 14 we're doing what we're doing.
- MS. HAUSER: Well, let me defer to Doug on that.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay.
- MS. HAUSER: He's been working on this issue.
- 18 So take it away, Doug.
- 19 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Johnson.
- 20 MR. JOHNSON: Okay. I'll be brief, because this
- 21 isn't the most exciting thing of all times.
- 22 Essentially, there's a lot of work that the Census does
- 23 to get ready for the next decennial census, mainly
- 24 focused on making sure that their boundaries are
- 25 correct. You guys may remember that -- was it Sierra

- 1 Vista called us a week before the final legislative plan
- 2 was adopted and said that we've split their city, and it
- 3 turned out that Census had the wrong order for their
- 4 city because they hadn't worked with the Census Bureau.
- 5 And the other thing they do is they provide
- 6 their address list to the city so the city can see what
- 7 homes it knows of that they missed just to make sure
- 8 that everyone will be counted completely.
- 9 And they need a designated liaison. In the
- 10 past it's been leg. counsel. But by federal law and
- 11 regulation, it has to be the official redistricting
- 12 body. And so the leg. counsel obviously said, "We're
- 13 not that." The legislature is not that anymore. So
- 14 they deferred. But the legislative staff, who obviously
- 15 will have to fund all the census stuff that we want to
- 16 get done, clearly happy to, they were concerned about
- 17 the Commission going out of existence and then all the
- 18 stuff falling apart.
- 19 And so everyone is essentially comfortable
- 20 with the Commission. As long as it's in existence,
- 21 we'll continue to be the liaison. And leg. counsel
- 22 wanted the Commission to designate leg. counsel as their
- 23 formal designee so that they wouldn't be caught in this
- 24 Catch 22 of they're not the official redistricting
- 25 authority, but the official redistricting authority

- 1 doesn't exist.
- 2 So these are laid out fairly well in the
- 3 resolution, I think. The underlying issue here is that
- 4 Census Bureau -- this is a voluntary preparation base.
- 5 If there's any controversy or Democrat versus
- 6 Republican, you know, conflict or any hitches, the
- 7 Census Bureau just walks away from the state. They say,
- 8 you know, it's not worth it to them to get caught in the
- 9 mix. So they just want to see is everyone working
- 10 together well, and if so, then they work with the state.
- 11 So this is kind of our way of showing we're all working
- 12 together well, and then we're off and running.
- 13 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay.
- 14 MR. JOHNSON: Most of the work is actually done
- 15 by the counties and then cities when it's actually being
- 16 done.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: All right. For the benefit of
- 18 the recorder, I'm going to ask the members of the
- 19 Commission to identify themselves when they speak. This
- 20 is the chairman again. And given Doug's explanation of
- 21 the draft resolution, I would entertain a motion to
- 22 adopt the draft resolution as presented.
- 23 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Mr. Chairman?
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Ms. Minkoff.
- 25 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yes. Andi Minkoff. And

- 1 I would move the adoption of the resolution as
- 2 presented.
- 3 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you. Is there a second?
- 4 MR. ELDER: Mr. Chairman, this is Dan Elder. I
- 5 second.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you, Mr. Elder. Moved and
- 7 seconded that the draft resolution be adopted by the
- 8 Commission. Is there discussion on the motion?
- 9 MR. HUNTWORK: Mr. Chairman.
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork.
- 11 MR. HUNTWORK: I have two qualifications that I'd
- 12 like to suggest that we consider. The first one is to
- 13 say that it was to serve --
- 14 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Where are you?
- MR. HUNTWORK: I'm in the resolution itself.
- 16 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yeah, but which part of
- 17 the resolution?
- 18 MR. HUNTWORK: I'd say the "Now, therefore" --
- 19 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Oh, okay.
- 20 MR. HUNTWORK: -- the resolution as I see it.
- 21 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Okay.
- MR. HUNTWORK: And I'm at the final sentence
- 23 where it says "serve," "...designates the nonpartisan
- 24 Arizona Legislative Council to serve.... I would like
- 25 to insert the words "at its own expense."

- And, secondly, after the word "commencing,"
- 2 I would like to insert the words "only if and when."
- 3 The second one is really a retentative lawyer change
- 4 that I would prefer to see. That's the convention I
- 5 usually use when drafting similar concepts. And I think
- 6 it adds some clarity to the statement.
- 7 The first one I am suggesting because I
- 8 believe that we not only have no authority to tax, but
- 9 we also have no authority to spend money as well. I
- 10 think it's implicit. We ought to make it explicit.
- 11 There may be money left in other budget.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. Mr. Huntwork, are you
- 13 offering those as amendments?
- MR. HUNTWORK: Yes. I would move the amendment
- 15 in those two --
- 16 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Can we do them as two
- 17 separate amendments? Because --
- 18 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Sure.
- 19 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: -- I have some questions
- 20 about one.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LYNN: We can do that. Why don't you
- 22 offer them one at a time, Mr. Huntwork, and then we'll
- 23 take them one at a time.
- MR. HUNTWORK: Very well. I move that we amend
- 25 the proposed resolution by inserting the words "at its

- 1 own sole cost and expense" following the words "to
- 2 serve."
- 3 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Is there a second to that
- 4 amendment?
- 5 MR. ELDER: Commissioner Elder. Second for the
- 6 purpose of discussion.
- 7 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you, Mr. Elder. Discussion
- 8 on the motion. Ms. Minkoff?
- 9 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yeah. This is the one
- 10 that I have a question on. It seems to me that after we
- 11 cease to exist, we don't have any money left in our
- 12 account anyway. Because when we have no more work to
- 13 do, whatever is left in our budget reverts to the
- 14 general fund. Is that correct?
- 15 MS. HAUSER: That's correct.
- 16 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: So I'm not sure that we
- 17 need this. And I'm wondering -- you know, it might be,
- 18 rather than its own expense, that the legislature would
- 19 develop a supplemental appropriation to pay for this,
- 20 you know, in a different way. And I don't -- I don't
- 21 know that we want to tie their hands. I mean,
- 22 obviously, the expense of it has to be borne by
- 23 somebody, and they can't take it out of our budget
- 24 because there won't be any money in our budget.
- 25 MS. HAUSER: Right. Mr. Chairman, may I speak to

- 1 that?
- 2 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Absolutely. Ms. Hauser.
- MS. HAUSER: I also don't think we necessarily
- 4 have the authority to do that. I understand
- 5 Commissioner Huntwork's intent, but we don't have the
- 6 authority to dictate how Legislative Council funds this
- 7 work. And I think that's the point that Commissioner
- 8 Minkoff is also making. So rather than create any kind
- 9 of lack of direct delegation to Legislative Council, in
- 10 other words, putting any kind of a hitch in it, I would
- 11 leave it out. That would be my recommendation legally.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork, the question for
- 13 me -- and I might suggest that after I make the
- 14 statement and ask the question, that I want to give you
- 15 the floor to perhaps think about this kind of
- 16 connection. I like your second amendment, but it seems
- 17 to me if the second amendment were included, the first
- 18 one would no longer be required. In other words, if we
- 19 are in charge, we'll pay for it. If we're no longer
- 20 able to be in charge, the discussion we just had
- 21 suggests that there is no money of ours. And however
- 22 the leg. counsel would then secure funds necessary to do
- 23 the work would be their problem. They obviously want
- 24 the work to be done as much as we do in preparation for
- 25 the 2011 redistricting process. So I would give you the

- 1 floor to respond to the comments made.
- 2 MR. HUNTWORK: Yes. Well, firstly, I think I
- 3 have to respond in the context that we would definitely
- 4 have to work this differently than I proposed. We would
- 5 have to word it in terms of at no expense to the
- 6 Commission rather than at the expense of Legislative
- 7 Council.
- 8 The second claim I would make is to take a
- 9 step back and say that if they're acting as our
- 10 designee, under ordinary principles of law, we as the
- 11 principal and they as the agent would be entitled to
- 12 reimbursement from the principal. And I think we need
- 13 to do something to negate that interest because the fact
- 14 that we have no money in our budget is exactly what I'm
- 15 worried about.
- 16 If I remember the legal analysis when we
- 17 were about to run out of money during the course of the
- 18 litigation, the law is that we commissioners are
- 19 individually liable for money spent by our Commission
- 20 that is in excess of or is not covered by our budget.
- 21 So --
- 22 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: How lovely.
- MR. HUNTWORK: And that was the advice that,
- 24 Lisa, I'm sure that we did receive from you. So since
- 25 we're designating them, I mean, the theory behind this

- 1 is that -- and I think it's probably legally a defensive
- 2 theory to begin with, because if we really cease to
- 3 exist, we can't have an agent out there acting on our
- 4 behalf. And probably the legislature needs to adopt
- 5 some law to fix that saying once the Commission ceases
- 6 to exist, leg. council is the proper value or something
- 7 like that. But I'm not suggesting we go there at all.
- 8 All I want to do is fix this within the four corners of
- 9 what we're dealing with. But I do think it should say
- 10 "at no expense to the Commission."
- 11 MS. HAUSER: Mr. Chairman.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Yes. Ms. Hauser.
- 13 MS. HAUSER: Just with respect to the legal
- 14 advice given previously with respect to work that the
- 15 Commission was doing without appropriated funds or
- 16 expecting to have to do without appropriated funds, the
- 17 principle there is different than this one. And I would
- 18 just say that the ordinary principles of agency don't
- 19 necessarily apply in this particular situation given the
- 20 structure of State government and particularly given the
- 21 Attorney General opinion that was issued recently
- 22 concerning the questions that we had about carrying out
- 23 our work. I mean, the Attorney General has clearly
- 24 indicated there that we can't pay for any of the work
- 25 that would go on after our existence, and we can't agree

- 1 to do so. But the work still has to go on. And this is
- 2 a way that we can accomplish that. And I would not have
- 3 any concerns whatsoever about anything coming back on
- 4 commissioners individually.
- 5 That said, I think the amendment, if
- 6 changed to "at no expense to the Commission," is
- 7 harmless. I mean, given the A. G. opinion, I don't
- 8 think it accomplishes much, but it's harmless enough and
- 9 would not be inappropriate.
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you.
- 11 Mr. Huntwork, would you be willing to
- 12 change the wording of the amendment to conform?
- 13 MR. HUNTWORK: Yes. I would change the wording
- 14 to "at no expense to the Commission."
- 15 CHAIRMAN LYNN: And Mr. Elder, would you second
- 16 that for the purpose of further discussion?
- 17 MR. ELDER: This is Mr. Elder. Yes.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you. Then with the amended
- 19 amendment, "at no further expense to the Commission,"
- 20 further discussion on the amendment?
- MS. HAUSER: Would it be "at no further expense"
- 22 or "at no expense."
- 23 CHAIRMAN LYNN: "No expense." I'm sorry. "No
- 24 expense."
- 25 Hearing none, we'll do this by roll call

- 1 because it's very hard to do this otherwise. Let me
- 2 call the roll on the amendment. Ms. Minkoff.
- 3 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yes.
- 4 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Elder.
- 5 MR. ELDER: Yes.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall.
- 7 MR. HALL: Do we mind reading it again?
- 8 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Sure.
- 9 MR. HALL: We had two amendments; right?
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: No. We're only doing the one.
- 11 And this first one is --
- MR. HALL: Okay. We're only doing the one. All
- 13 right.
- 14 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you.
- 15 And Mr. Huntwork?
- 16 MR. HUNTWORK: Aye.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: And the Chair votes aye. Motion
- 18 carries five/zero on the first amendment.
- 19 Mr. Huntwork.
- 20 MR. HUNTWORK: The second proposal is we add the
- 21 word "only if and" immediately prior to the word "when."
- 22 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. And is there a second to
- 23 that amendment?
- 24 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Andi Minkoff, and I'll
- 25 second it.

- 1 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you.
- Ms. Hauser just to cut to the chase, does
- 3 this one present any difficulty?
- 4 MS. HAUSER: No. I don't necessarily think it's
- 5 essential because the "when" happens only if.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LYNN: I understand.
- 7 MS. HAUSER: I mean, I like to, you know,
- 8 eliminate unnecessary words, but it's not a problem to
- 9 do that.
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Further discussion on the
- 11 amendment? Hearing none, roll call. Ms. Minkoff.
- 12 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yes.
- 13 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Elder.
- MR. ELDER: Yes.
- 15 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall.
- 16 MR. HALL: Aye.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork.
- 18 MR. HUNTWORK: Yes.
- 19 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Chair votes aye. Motion carries.
- There are now two amendments to the draft
- 21 resolution that have been passed. Is there an
- 22 affirmative -- let's see. We have --
- 23 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: We have the motion.
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: We have the motion to adopt the
- 25 resolution as amended. But is there further discussion

- 1 on that motion? Hearing none, roll call. Ms. Minkoff.
- VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Yes.
- 3 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Elder.
- 4 MR. ELDER: Yes.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall.
- 6 MR. HALL: Aye.
- 7 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork.
- 8 MR. HUNTWORK: Yes.
- 9 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Chair votes aye. Motion carries,
- 10 five/zero.
- 11 That concludes the agenda. And I wish you
- 12 all a terrific new year. And, hopefully, we'll see each
- 13 other soon, but not necessarily face to face in a
- 14 meeting.
- 15 VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: I'll vote aye on that,
- 16 too.
- 17 MS. HAUSER: I will make these changes and send
- 18 the document back out to everyone, and then you'll go
- 19 ahead and sign it.
- 20 CHAIRMAN LYNN: I will sign it, and we'll file
- 21 it.
- MR. ELDER: Do we have any time line on when
- 23 we'll expect to receive anything from the court?
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Lisa, I think that was a question
- 25 to you.

1	MS. HAUSER: Oh. No, that's not on the agenda.
2	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Right. Well, let's adjourn and
3	have a conversation, anyone who wishes to.
4	VICE-CHAIRMAN MINKOFF: Well, that's probably a
5	violation of
6	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Probably is. But the answer
7	was the answer was no. The Commission will stand
8	adjourned pending a call to the chair. Thank you all
9	very much.
