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6	CHAIRMAN LYNN: We'll call the meeting to
7	order.
8	The first item of business is public
9	comment. And I wanted to ask either Howie or Ann if they
10	wanted to address the Commission.
11	MR. FISCHER: No, other than the concerns
12	that you have four agendas with exactly the same items on
13	it which seems to me to suggest at least skirting the
14	intent of the open meeting law which is to tell people
15	what is going on.
16	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Howie, we'll deal with that
17	kind of question when we're finished. I'm not going to
18	take that up in the meeting itself; but that's a
19	misinterpretation of what we've done. You and I will
20	talk about that.
21	Ann, anything from you?
22	MS. ESCHINGER: No.
23	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Item III is possibility of
24	an Executive Session.
25	Let me ask the attorneys if they would, do

- 1 they wish an Executive Session at this time?
- 2 MR. RIVERA: Yeah, I think that's a good
- 3 idea, right, Lisa?
- 4 MS. HAUSER: Yeah.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Pursuant to A.R.S.
- 6 38-431.03(A)(3) and 38-431.03(A)(4), is there a motion
- 7 for Executive Session?
- 8 COMMISSIONER HALL: So moved.
- 9 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Second.
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: All in favor?
- 11 COMMISSIONER HALL: "Aye."
- 12 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: "Aye."
- 13 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: "Aye."
- 14 CHAIRMAN LYNN: "Aye."
- Motion passes.
- 16 I'd ask people remove themselves, excuse
- 17 themselves, and when --
- 18 MR. ECHEVESTE: Can you give a time frame
- 19 for yourselves?
- 20 CHAIRMAN LYNN: I'd guess a half hour to 45
- 21 minutes.
- 22 Lisa?
- MS. HAUSER: Yeah.
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Adolfo, I want to make sure
- 25 whatever speaker you have there is not loud enough to be

- 1 heard outside the office.
- 2 MR. ECHEVESTE: All right.
- 3 CHAIRMAN LYNN: All right?
- 4 MR. ECHEVESTE: All right.
- 5 (Whereupon, the Commission recessed Open
- 6 Public Session to convene in Executive
- 7 Session from 8:14 a.m until 9:15 a.m. when
- 8 Open Public Session reconvened.)
- 9 MR. ECHEVESTE: We have everybody in the
- 10 room. We'll have them introduced.
- 11 MR. FISCHER: Howard Fischer, Capitol Media
- 12 Services.
- MR. DAVENPORT: Paul Davenport, A.P.
- 14 MS. ESCHINGER: Ann Eschinger.
- MR. VOSS: Dave Voss, Democratic House.
- 16 REPRESENTATIVE GALLARDO: Steve Gallardo
- 17 State Representative.
- 18 (Michael Mandell is also present.)
- 19 MR. RIVERA: Welcome back, Steve.
- 20 REPRESENTATIVE GALLARDO: Welcome back.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Call the meeting back to
- 22 order.
- 23 Item IV, possible discussion, decision and
- 24 or adoption of resolution related to the Commission's
- 25 finances, payment of contractors, the Commission's

- 1 continued operation and or possible future legal action
- 2 or litigation.
- 3 Any discussion on this item? Anything to
- 4 bring up?
- 5 If not.
- 6 MS. HAUSER: Steve, I'd at least probably
- 7 note for the record not until we have some further news
- 8 from the Legislature.
- 9 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay.
- 10 Any other discussion on Item IV?
- 11 Item V, possible discussion, decision, and
- 12 or approval of an IGA with Maricopa County for the
- 13 purpose of providing financial assistance to the
- 14 Commission.
- 15 Anything on this issue?
- 16 COMMISSIONER HALL: Mr. Chairman.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall.
- 18 COMMISSIONER HALL: In light of the fact
- 19 that our counsel is utilizing all and more than available
- 20 of their time in litigation that is pending, I would move
- 21 that we would assign Commissioner Huntwork to continue in
- 22 discussions regarding this matter.
- 23 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Is there a second?
- 24 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: I'll second it.
- 25 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you, Ms. Minkoff.

- 1 Discussion on the motion designating
- 2 Commissioner Huntwork as our liaison on this particular
- 3 issue?
- 4 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: Mr. Chairman, I
- 5 think certainly if we're going to have a liaison,
- 6 Mr. Huntwork is more than capable. I think the important
- 7 issue is that unless and until we have a secure source of
- 8 funding, we have to explore every possible option that
- 9 will allow the Commission to go forward and do the work
- 10 that it's been assigned to do. And this appears to be a
- 11 viable option. I believe we have to pursue it. And I
- 12 believe Mr. Huntwork is more than capable of pursuing it
- 13 for us.
- 14 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you, Ms. Minkoff.
- 15 Any more discussion?
- 16 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: I'm happy to do it.
- 17 I'd do it in my capacity as a Commissioner, not in a
- 18 capacity as a lawyer.
- 19 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: That means you can't
- 20 bill us.
- 21 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: That's right.
- 22 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Understood. I appreciate
- 23 that distinction.
- 24 COMMISSIONER HALL: We can't afford you.
- 25 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Right. Your rate is much

- 1 lower as a Commissioner than as a lawyer.
- 2 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: That's right,
- 3 priceless.
- 4 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Any further discussion on
- 5 the motion?
- 6 Well, that's interesting.
- 7 COMMISSIONER ELDER: And I'm not there.
- 8 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Interesting music.
- 9 All those favor of the motion, signify
- 10 "aye."
- 11 COMMISSIONER ELDER: "Aye."
- 12 COMMISSIONER HALL: "Aye."
- 13 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: "Aye."
- 14 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: "Aye."
- 15 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Chair votes "Aye."
- 16 Motion carries. So ordered.
- 17 Item VI, possible discussion and or
- 18 decision related to affirmation, modification or repeal
- 19 of the current redistricting plans.
- 20 Ladies and gentlemen, Commission, this item
- 21 is on this agenda and will also appear on future agendas
- 22 because it is a, an -- certainly an issue that may, at
- 23 some point very soon, have relevance beyond its current
- 24 level of interest, but it is something that we obviously
- 25 need to maintain as an option depending, of course, on

- 1 our funding and how the preparation for trial and the
- 2 trial itself is preceding.
- 3 Is there any specific discussion on Item VI
- 4 for today?
- 5 If not, Item VII.
- 6 Before we adjourn, I want to direct a
- 7 question to staff.
- 8 We have noticed meetings for the remainder
- 9 of the week. And we want to meet only when there is a
- 10 reason to meet based on either progress on funding,
- 11 progress on litigation, and so on, that would mirror the
- 12 items that we have noticed as an agenda for recent
- 13 maintaining meetings.
- 14 If we were to contact staff, Adolfo.
- MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes. I'm here.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: If we were to contact
- 17 staff, say, by 3:00 p.m. on the day prior to a noticed
- 18 meeting with the information as to whether or not we
- 19 would go forward with the meeting or would cancel the
- 20 meeting based on no specific need to meet that day, would
- 21 that be sufficient time for you to notice the
- 22 cancellation and or prepare for the meeting the next
- 23 morning?
- 24 MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes, it is, provided
- 25 that -- well, we've already noticed the meeting. So as

- 1 long as that is in place, I believe the cancellation is
- 2 something that can be done very quickly. And to
- 3 certainly set up for the actual meeting, that's no
- 4 problem.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay.
- 6 COMMISSIONER ELDER: Commissioner Elder.
- 7 Is there any statutory rule in relation to cancellation
- 8 as far as time?
- 9 CHAIRMAN LYNN: No.
- MS. HAUSER: No.
- 11 CHAIRMAN LYNN: No. You can cancel a
- 12 meeting as long as it's properly noticed. You can have
- 13 it, cancel any time.
- 14 MS. HAUSER: We'd like to be able to
- 15 cancel -- don't want to inconvenience people having them
- 16 show up at 8:00 o'clock in the morning, or whatever, and
- 17 then finding out it's canceled. It's better, as
- 18 suggested, to do it in the afternoon before, we get that
- 19 information to DOA, post it, and have it posted on the
- 20 website as well so people interested can continue to
- 21 check the website.
- 22 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Can we say at this point
- 23 we'll probably not need the meeting tomorrow and will
- 24 cancel or should we wait until 3:00 this afternoon to
- 25 make that determination?

- 1 COMMISSIONER HALL: I say we just cancel
- 2 it.
- 3 COMMISSIONER ELDER: I'd agree with that.
- 4 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: I didn't hear. I'm
- 5 sorry.
- 6 CHAIRMAN LYNN: The question, Andi, is
- 7 whether or not we can say --
- 8 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: I heard the
- 9 question. But Dan said he agreed with something. I
- 10 didn't hear what he agreed with.
- 11 COMMISSIONER ELDER: Joshua said he felt we
- 12 should cancel for tomorrow.
- 13 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: The possibility of
- 14 anything happening today we'll need to react to tomorrow,
- 15 the only reason for keeping it --
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Yeah, that's probably a
- 17 good question.
- 18 Why don't we leave it as is and by 3:00
- 19 o'clock I'll try to make that determination. And at this
- 20 point I don't think there's a reason for a meeting, but
- 21 things might change today depending on the Legislature
- 22 and other developments.
- 23 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: Staff will e-mail us
- 24 what the decision is?
- 25 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Yeah. I think just so

- 1 there's no confusion, not only e-mail, I think I'll ask
- 2 the staff to call and also leave a voice mail message
- 3 whether or not there's a meeting and, if so, at what
- 4 time.
- 5 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: Great.
- 6 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Is there any way to
- 7 be courteous to the press, let Howie --
- 8 What's the easiest way to find out what
- 9 we're doing?
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: The website will have the
- 11 most current information as well as notification at the
- 12 Capitol.
- 13 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: The website, I went
- 14 there last night. I had not received the agenda for
- 15 today's meeting. I pulled it off the website. The only
- 16 thing I saw there last night was today's meeting.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Well, let's --
- 18 Adolfo, let's make sure the website carries
- 19 the other meetings as well.
- 20 MR. ECHEVESTE: Oh. All right.
- 21 MR. JONES: Sir, Tim was not in on Friday.
- 22 So he wasn't there to receive the e-mail that was sent to
- 23 him on the agendas that were posted on Friday.
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay, Lou.
- 25 He should have those posted by today?

- 1 MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes. We'll make sure he
- 2 does that.
- 3 CHAIRMAN LYNN: All right.
- 4 Any further business?
- 5 COMMISSIONER HALL: Mr. Chairman, is it
- 6 appropriate to reopen public comment if someone wants to
- 7 address the Commission?
- 8 CHAIRMAN LYNN: More than appropriate to do
- 9 that.
- 10 We've been joined by other guests.
- 11 Ms. Hauser?
- 12 MS. HAUSER: Also double-check. We're also
- 13 going to notice Friday now?
- 14 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Notice Friday. 8:30 to
- 15 9:30.
- MS. HAUSER: Okay.
- 17 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Without objection, we'll
- 18 return to Item II, and I'd ask if anybody from the public
- 19 wishes to address the Commission.
- 20 Hearing none and noting that our, at least
- 21 the crowd present certainly is not bashful, I must
- 22 conclude that members of the public are not interested in
- 23 addressing the Commission at this time.
- MR. ECHEVESTE: Mr. Chairman, just for the
- 25 record, Michael Mandell is here, also. He was not here

CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. Thank you. 2 Any further business to come before the 3 Commission at this time? 4 5 If not, Item VII, the Commission will stand 6 adjourned. We will determine by 3:00 p.m. this 7 afternoon as to whether or not we will meet tomorrow and 8 9 will determine in subsequent days by 3:00 p.m. the 10 previous day as to whether or not a noted Commission meeting will take place during the remainder of the week. 11 12 Thank you all very much. 13 MR.
