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6	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Let's call the meeting	10
	We'll do roll call for the record.	
8	Ms. Minkoff.	
9	COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: Yes.	
10	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Hall?	
11	COMMISSIONER HALL: Yes.	
12	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Elder.	
13	COMMISSIONER ELDER: Yes.	
14	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Chairman is present.	. We're

16	Legal counsel. Ms. Hauser?	
17	MS. HAUSER: Yes.	
18	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Rivera?	
19	MR. RIVERA: Yes.	
20	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Staff?	
21	MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes, we're here.	
22	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Has anyone else joine	ed us
23 in the	office?	
24	MR. DAVENPORT: Just Paul Davenport.	
25	CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. First, I should	l ,

- 1 before we move into the agenda formally, for the record,
- 2 I want to indicate that on Wednesday the Governor did
- 3 sign the appropriation, supplemental appropriation for
- 4 \$1.7 million, as you all know. I am preparing a letter
- 5 to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House,
- 6 and Governor thanking each of them for their work in
- 7 providing the supplemental appropriation.
- 8 The other thing that I think has been
- 9 posted publicly is the fact that the Court, the trial
- 10 Court, has ruled on the summary judgment motion with
- 11 respect to the Navajo case, and they have ruled in the
- 12 Commission's favor. So that case will not be heard at
- 13 trial, although obviously that ruling is subject to
- 14 appeal. I think everybody is aware of those, of those
- 15 happenings this week.
- 16 MR. ECHEVESTE: There was a big article in
- 17 the paper this morning on it.
- 18 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Okay. All right.
- 19 Public comment?
- 20 Are there members of the public that wish
- 21 to be heard at this time?
- MR. ECHEVESTE: No, there --
- 23 CHAIRMAN LYNN: If not, I think it would be
- 24 appropriate, and I do think there is some information
- 25 that might be useful to the Commission in terms of

- 1 ongoing litigation. So I would suggest that we have a
- 2 brief, and in this case I think probably 15, 20 minutes
- 3 will do it, Executive Session, and then return to the
- 4 regular agenda.
- 5 So, in order to accomplish that, pursuant
- 6 to A.R.S. 38-431.03(A)(3) and/or A.R.S. 38-431.03(A)(4),
- 7 I'd entertain a motion to go into Executive Session.
- 8 Is it so moved?
- 9 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: Yes.
- 10 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Second?
- 11 COMMISSIONER ELDER: Second.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LYNN: All in favor?
- 13 COMMISSIONER HALL: "Aye."
- 14 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: "Aye."
- 15 COMMISSIONER ELDER: "Aye."
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Opposed, say "No"?
- 17 Motion carries.
- Adolfo, if you would tell us when we're in
- 19 a secure position.
- 20 (Whereupon, the Commission recessed Open
- 21 Public Session to convene in Executive
- Session from 8:40 a.m until 9:32 a.m. when
- 23 Open Public Session reconvened.)
- 24 (Mr. Huntwork is present telephonically.)
- 25 CHAIRMAN LYNN: I'd call the regular

- 1 session back to order.
- 2 Item IV on the agenda.
- 3 MS. HAUSER: What is that?
- 4 MR. ECHEVESTE: That is the other line.
- 5 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Item IV on the agenda,
- 6 possible discussion, decision, adoption of resolution
- 7 related to Commission finances, payment of contractors,
- 8 the Commission's continued operation and/or possible
- 9 future legal action or litigation.
- 10 To that item, I'd ask Mr. Echeveste if he'd
- 11 give a brief summary of the, essentially a cash flow
- 12 report.
- What I'm interested in, Mr. Echeveste, is
- 14 if you would inform the Commission as to the balances in
- 15 our account at its lowest level and also what the current
- 16 balance is in light of additional appropriations having
- 17 been made.
- 18 MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes.
- 19 Mr. Chairman, let me just, by way of
- 20 explanation, point out we -- we were projecting a balance
- 21 of about \$75,000 when we met last because of anticipated
- 22 expenditures of \$97,529 that Lisa projected. That did
- 23 not -- it was not that high. Subsequently, with the
- 24 current expenditures, that actually I'm doing on a
- 25 notebook now, that brought us down to about 95 -- let's

- 1 see -- about 95,000. And that was the lowest amount that
- 2 we have -- that's our balance, with all expenses.
- 3 MS. HAUSER: Not our current balance,
- 4 though.
- 5 MR. ECHEVESTE: Taking Doug Johnson out of
- 6 there.
- 7 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Echeveste, I understand
- 8 the report to say, at its lowest level, we had about
- 9 \$95,000 left in the original allocation.
- 10 MR. ECHEVESTE: Correct.
- 11 CHAIRMAN LYNN: It is your understanding
- 12 the Treasurer subsequently credited our account with a
- 13 supplemental appropriation of 1.7 million?
- 14 MR. ECHEVESTE: That is correct, I believe
- 15 effective yesterday.
- 16 CHAIRMAN LYNN: So is it then your report
- 17 that the current balance for the Commission is somewhere
- 18 between \$1.7 and \$1.8 million?
- 19 MR. ECHEVESTE: Yes, approximately 1.795,
- 20 or so.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Thank you.
- 22 Any questions of Mr. Echeveste?
- 23 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Mr. Chairman,
- 24 Mr. Huntwork?
- 25 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: If we look at all

- 1 accruals during, up to the present time, up to the point
- 2 at which the 1.7 came in, what would they total,
- 3 including Doug, and legal fees, and everything else all
- 4 wrapped together, just -- I don't want you to break it
- 5 out, Adolfo, give me a lump sum, please.
- 6 MR. ECHEVESTE: Lisa --
- 7 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Don't break
- 8 anything out, all office expenses -- I want to make sure
- 9 I understand that -- what that 95,000 represents. We
- 10 have 1.7 moving forward.
- 11 MR. ECHEVESTE: Correct.
- 12 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: 95 covers
- 13 everything that happened up to the present time?
- 14 Correct?
- 15 MR. ECHEVESTE: Correct.
- 16 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: I want to know if
- 17 it does.
- 18 MR. ECHEVESTE: Absolutely.
- 19 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Okay.
- 20 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Any other questions of
- 21 Mr. Echeveste?
- 22 If not, the Chair would entertain a motion
- 23 relative to expenses incurred in conjunction with our
- 24 legal defense up to this point.
- 25 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Mr. Chairman.

- 1 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Mr. Huntwork.
- 2 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: We were, of course,
- 3 at the beginning of October, forced to make some very
- 4 hard decisions with the idea in mind that we were about
- 5 to run out of money. And in the course of that, among
- 6 other things, we ordered our attorneys to stop working.
- 7 The Court on the other hand ordered them to continue
- 8 working. And they were ethically obligated to do so.
- 9 The issue that now, situation that now confronts us is
- 10 that the decisions we took on the premise that we were
- 11 going to run out of money have never eventuated. We in
- 12 fact did not run out of money and, in fact, the, thanks
- 13 to quick action of the Legislature and the quick action
- 14 of the Governor in signing the new appropriation, we have
- 15 enough money to pay all of our interim expenses and
- 16 enough money to go full speed ahead with the trial
- 17 pending in Superior Court. So for all those reasons,
- 18 Mr. Chairman, I would make the motion that we pay in full
- 19 for all legal services that have been rendered to date by
- 20 our attorneys at their standard hourly rates.
- 21 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Is there a second to that
- 22 motion?
- 23 COMMISSIONER ELDER: Second.
- 24 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Moved and seconded.
- 25 Discussion on the motion?

- 1 If not, all those in favor of the motion,
- 2 signify by saying "Aye."
- 3 COMMISSIONER MINKOFF: "Aye."
- 4 COMMISSIONER HALL: "Aye."
- 5 COMMISSIONER ELDER: "Aye."
- 6 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: "Aye."
- 7 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Chair votes "Aye."
- 8 Opposed, "No"?
- 9 Motion carried and is so ordered.
- 10 Any other item of business under Item IV of
- 11 the agenda?
- 12 If not, Item V, "possible discussion,
- 13 decision, and/or approval of an IGA with Maricopa County
- 14 for the purpose of providing financial assistance to the
- 15 Commission."
- Mr. Huntwork, anything to report on this
- 17 item?
- 18 COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Mr. Chairman,
- 19 Maricopa County continued to be very cooperative and
- 20 receptive to our request to -- for assistance right up
- 21 until the moment that the legislation was passed and the
- 22 Governor signed the bill. At that point, obviously,
- 23 further discussions became moot for the time being and we
- 24 discontinued them but on the note that if their
- 25 assistance was needed in the future, at least the door

- 1 continued to be open for further discussions.
- 2 CHAIRMAN LYNN: And we certainly should
- 3 express to Maricopa County and their representatives our
- 4 appreciation of their williness to intercede in the
- 5 action, to intercede in securing supplemental
- 6 appropriations.
- 7 Item VI, any discussion related to Item VI
- 8 on the agenda?
- 9 If not, is there anything further from
- 10 legal counsel?
- 11 MR. RIVERA: No.
- 12 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Anything further from
- 13 staff?
- 14 MR. ECHEVESTE: No.
- 15 CHAIRMAN LYNN: Anything from the
- 16 Commission?
- 17 Item VII, adjournment.
- 18 The Commission will stand adjourned subject
- 19 to the call of the Chair and proper notification of a
- 20 subsequent meeting.
- 21 For the Commissioners, the anticipation is
- 22 we will not anticipate we'll need a meeting next week.
- 23 Trial preparation and trial continues. If that becomes
- 24 necessary, we'll properly notify the public and notify
- 25 you of the need for a meeting and, as always, consult

1	with you about when that meeting could occur.

4	COMMISSIONER HUNTWORK: Thank you
